Scotland to England Green Link – SEGL2

Non-statutory public consultation

The Scotland to England Green Link - SEGL2 - is a proposed project by National Grid that will help to deliver greener energy to homes and businesses across the UK.

If approved, the project will increase the capacity of our network between Scotland, with its many renewable energy sources, and the rest of the country, helping the country meet its net zero ambitions. To do this, we are proposing the construction of a new High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) link - an electrical superhighway - between Peterhead in Aberdeenshire and Drax in North Yorkshire, travelling most of its way under the North Sea.
